The Campus Law Centre is organizing a Competition for creating awareness about Population Laws among the students on **February 26, 2018**. There would be **two rounds** in the competition, Preliminary Round and Final Round. The **Preliminary Round** would consist of a written test containing 25 objective questions (**Multiple Choice Questions**) from prescribed syllabus. **Ten Students will be** shortlisted for the **Final Round**. In **Final Round** each student would be given five minutes to *speak on the topic* “**Does India need a Population Stabilization Law?**”

The competition will cover following:

- Census of India, 2011 (India’s Demographic Scenario)
- Relevant provisions of the Constitution of India, 1950
- The Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques Act, 1994
- The Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006
- The Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1971
- Relevant provisions of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 on Sterilisation
- Relevant provisions of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 on Abortion
- The Local Government in Delhi (Disqualification for Membership) (Small Family) Act, 1996
- The Rajasthan Municipalities (Amendment) Act, 1992
- The Rajasthan Panchayat Raj (Amendment) Act, 1995
- The Small Family Acts for Civic Bodies (Like Rajasthan as mentioned above) of other States.
- National Population Policy, 2000
- National Population Commission, 2000
- National Health Policy, 2017
- Other related areas, concepts, and case laws.

The competition is **open only to students of Campus Law Centre**. There is **no registration fee**. The registration is open from **February 15, 2018 to February 18, 2018 till 05:00 PM**.
